A BILL

To extend the existing temporary suspension of duty on fusilade.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. FUSILADE.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.29.72 of the Har-
5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended
6 by striking out “12/31/90” and inserting “12/31/93”.

7 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—Except as provided in sub-
8 section (c), the amendment made by subsection (a) applies
9 with respect to goods entered, or withdrawn from ware-
10 house for consumption, on or after the 15th day after the
11 date of the enactment of this Act.

1 (c) RELIQUIDATION.—Notwithstanding section 514
2 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1514) or any other
3 provision of law, upon proper request filed with the appro-
4 priate customs officer not later than 90 days after the date
5 of the enactment of this Act, any entry of an article de-
6 scribed in heading 9902.29.72 of the Harmonized Tariff
7 Schedule of the United States that was made—

8 (1) after December 31, 1990; and

9 (2) before the date that is 15 days after the
10 date of the enactment of this Act;

11 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as though such entry
12 had occurred on the date that is 15 days after the date
13 of the enactment of this Act.
