Designating March 25, 1994, as “Greek Independence Day: A National Day of Celebration of Greek and American Democracy”.

**JOINT RESOLUTION**

Designating March 25, 1994, as “Greek Independence Day: A National Day of Celebration of Greek and American Democracy”.

Whereas the ancient Greeks developed the concept of democracy, in which the supreme power to govern was vested in the people;

Whereas the Founding Fathers of the United States drew heavily upon the political experience and philosophy of ancient Greece in forming the representative democracy of the United States;

Whereas these and other ideals have forged a close bond both between the United States and Greece and between their peoples;

Whereas March 25, 1994, marks the 173<sup>rd</sup> anniversary of the beginning of the revolution that freed Greek people from the Ottoman Empire and enabled the reestablishment of democracy in Greece; and

Whereas it is proper and desirable to celebrate that anniversary with the Greek people and to reaffirm the democratic principles from which the United States and Greece were born: Now, therefore, be it

1       *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*  
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
3 That March 25, 1994, is designated as “Greek Independ-  
4 ence Day: A National Day of Celebration of Greek and  
5 American Democracy”, and the President is authorized  
6 and requested to issue a proclamation calling on the people  
7 of the United States to observe the day with appropriate  
8 ceremonies and activities.
