Mr. BURNS (for himself, Mr. WOFFORD, and Mr. GRASSLEY) introduced the following joint resolution; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

JOINT RESOLUTION

To designate Sunday, October 9, 1994, as “National Clergy Appreciation Day”.

Whereas members of the clergy enrich our lives on a day to day basis with their faithful support, encouragement, and kindness;

Whereas members of the clergy embody a standard of decency and respect by which we can measure our attitudes and lifestyles;

Whereas members of the clergy exemplify solid moral values and a strong commitment to community service;

Whereas members of the clergy in America are faithful workers who give their lives to the betterment of our lives; and

Whereas it is altogether fitting to set aside a day to honor
and recognize those who serve so selflessly: Now, there-
fore, be it

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That Sunday, October 9, 1994, is designated “National
4 Clergy Appreciation Day”, and the President is authorized
5 and requested to issue a proclamation calling upon the
6 people of the United States to observe this day with appro-
7 priate ceremonies and activities.
