Designating August 2, 1994, as “National Neighborhood Crime Watch Day”.

IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

JULY 21 (legislative day, JULY 20), 1994

Mr. RIEGLE introduced the following joint resolution; which was read twice
and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

JOINT RESOLUTION

Designating August 2, 1994, as “National Neighborhood
Crime Watch Day”.

Whereas neighborhood crime is of continuing concern to the
American people;

Whereas the fight against neighborhood crime requires people
to work together in cooperation with law enforcement of-
ficials;

Whereas neighborhood crime watch organizations are effec-
tive at promoting awareness about, and the participation
of volunteers in, crime prevention activities at the local
level;

Whereas neighborhood crime watch groups can contribute to
the Nation’s war on drugs by helping to prevent their
communities from becoming markets for drug dealers;
and

Whereas citizens across America will soon take part in a “National Night Out”, a unique crime prevention event which will demonstrate the importance and effectiveness of community participation in crime prevention efforts by having people spend the period from 8 to 9 o’clock postmeridian on August 2, 1994, with their neighbors in front of their homes: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That August 2, 1994, is designated as “National Neigh-
4 borhood Crime Watch Day”, and the President is author-
5 ized and requested to issue a proclamation calling upon
6 the people of the United States to observe such day with
7 appropriate programs, ceremonies, and activities.
