RESOLUTION

To authorize representation of Members of the Senate in the case of Bobbie Hill v. Bill Clinton, et al.

Whereas, in the case of Bobbie Hill v. Bill Clinton, et al., No. 92-6171, pending in the Circuit Court of Pulaski County, Arkansas, the plaintiff has named, among others, Senator Dale Bumpers and Senator David Pryor as defendants; and

Whereas, pursuant to sections 703(a) and 704(a)(1) of the Ethics in Government Act of 1978, 2 U.S.C. §§ 288b(a) and 288c(a)(1), the Senate may direct its counsel to defend Members of the Senate in civil actions relating to their official or representative capacity: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That, the Senate Legal Counsel is directed
