- Whereas, pursuant to such Act, the United States Holocaust Memorial Council has designated April 14 through April 21, 1996, as "Days of Remembrance of Victims of the Holocaust"; and
- Whereas the United States Holocaust Memorial Council has recommended that a one-hour ceremony be held at noon on April 16, 1996, consisting of speeches, readings, and musical presentations as part of the days of remembrance activities: Now, therefore, be it

- 6 out in accordance with such conditions as may be pre-
- 7 scribed by the Architect of the Capitol.
