CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Permitting the use of the rotunda of the Capitol for a ceremony to commemorate the days of remembrance of victims of the Holocaust.

Whereas, pursuant to such Act, the United States Holocaust Memorial Council has designated April 14 through April 21, 1996, as “Days of Remembrance of Victims of the Holocaust”; and

Whereas the United States Holocaust Memorial Council has recommended that a one-hour ceremony be held at noon on April 16, 1996, consisting of speeches, readings, and musical presentations as part of the days of remembrance activities: Now, therefore, be it

1 itol is hereby authorized to be used on April 16, 1996 from
2 8 o'clock ante meridian until 3 o'clock post meridian for
3 a ceremony as part of the commemoration of the days of
4 remembrance of victims of the Holocaust. Physical prep-
5 arations for the conduct of the ceremony shall be carried
6 out in accordance with such conditions as may be pre-
7 scribed by the Architect of the Capitol.
