CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To establish a Commission on Women's Art in the United States Capitol.

- Whereas, in 1995, the United States marked the 75th anniversary of the right of women to participate in Government through suffrage;
- Whereas this right was established by the ratification of the 19th Amendment to the Constitution of the United States;
- Whereas art and the depiction of life in the United States Capitol is an important way to honor and revere the contributions of persons who have contributed to the history of the United States; and
- Whereas the contributions of women in the history of the United States, including the current century, are

underrepresented in the art and the depiction of life in the United States Capitol: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate
 concurring),

3 SECTION 1. ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMISSION.

4 (a) ESTABLISHMENT AND MEMBERSHIP.—There is
5 established a Commission on Women's Art in the United
6 States Capitol (hereinafter referred to as the "Commis-7 sion") to be composed of—

8 (1) three Senators appointed by the Majority9 Leader of the Senate—

10 (A) two of whom shall be members of the
11 majority party and one of whom shall be a
12 member of the minority party, and

13 (B) two of whom shall be women;

14 (2) three Members of the House of Representa15 tives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Rep16 resentatives—

17 (A) two of whom shall be members of the
18 majority party and one of whom shall be a
19 member of the minority party, and

20 (B) two of whom shall be women; and
21 (3) five private citizens interested in and knowl22 edgeable about the arts appointed by the Majority
23 Leader of the Senate and the Speaker of the House
24 of Representatives—

1	(A) one of whom shall be a representative
2	from the United States Capitol Historical Soci-
3	ety,
4	(B) one of whom shall be a representative
5	from the National Women's Party Sewall-Bel-
6	mont House Museum, and
7	(C) one of whom shall be a representative
8	from the National Museum of Women in the
9	Arts.
10	(b) Completion of AppointmentsNot later
11	than 60 days after the date of the adoption of this resolu-
12	tion, the Majority Leader of the Senate and the Speaker
13	of the House of Representatives shall appoint members of
14	the Commission pursuant to subsection (a).
15	(c) CHAIRPERSON.—The chairperson of the Commis-
16	sion for the first 12 months of operation of the Commis-
17	sion shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
18	Representatives from the individuals appointed under sub-
19	section $(a)(2)$. The chairperson of the Commission for the
20	remainder of the period of operation of the Commission
21	shall be appointed by the Majority Leader of the Senate
22	from among the individuals appointed under subsection
23	(a)(1).

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(d) MAJORITY VOTE.—No recommendation shall be
 made by the Commission except upon a majority vote of
 the members.

4 SEC. 2. STUDY OF WOMEN'S ART IN THE UNITED STATES 5 CAPITOL.

6 The Commission shall conduct a comprehensive study
7 of matters relating to the representation of women in his8 tory (including the current century) in the United States
9 Capitol.

10 SEC. 3. AUTHORITY OF COMMISSION.

11 The Commission is authorized to—

(1) sit and act at such places and times within
the United States during the sessions, recesses, and
adjourned periods of Congress; and

(2) require the attendance of such witnesses
and the production of such books, papers, and documents; administer such oaths; take such testimony;
and procure such printing and binding as it considers necessary.

20 SEC. 4. STAFF OF COMMISSION.

(a) APPOINTMENT AND COMPENSATION OF STAFF.—
The Commission may appoint and fix the compensation
of such staff as it considers necessary and shall use existing staff to the extent possible.

1 (b) SERVICES OF OTHER CONGRESSIONAL ENTI-2 TIES.—The Commission may use such voluntary and uncompensated services as it considers necessary and may 3 use the services, information, facilities, and personnel of 4 5 the General Accounting Office, the Congressional Budget Office, the Congressional Research Service of the Library 6 7 of Congress, and other entities of the legislative branch. 8 (c) TRAVEL AND OTHER EXPENSES.—The members 9 of the Commission who are appointed under subsection 10 (a)(3) shall be reimbursed for travel, subsistence, and other necessary expenses incurred by them in the perform-11 ance of the duties vested in the Commission. 12

13 SEC. 5. EXPENSES.

14 Notwithstanding any law, rule, or other authority, 15 there shall be paid from the applicable accounts of the House of Representatives such sums as may be necessary 16 17 for one-half of the expenses of the Commission. Such payments shall be made on vouchers signed by the House of 18 Representatives chairperson of the Commission and ap-19 20 proved in the manner directed by the Committee on House 21 Oversight of the House of Representatives. Amounts made 22 available under this section shall be expended in accord-23 ance with regulations prescribed by the Committee on 24 House Oversight of the House of Representatives.

1 SEC. 6. REPORTS.

2 (a) INTERIM REPORT.—Not later than 12 months
3 after the date of the adoption this resolution, the Commis4 sion shall submit to Congress an interim report.

5 (b) FINAL REPORT.—Not later than 24 months after 6 the date of the adoption this resolution, the Commission 7 shall submit to Congress a final report containing a de-8 tailed statement of the findings and conclusions of the 9 Commission.

10 SEC. 7. TERMINATION OF COMMISSION.

11 The Commission shall cease to exist 60 days after12 the date of the submission of its final report under section13 6(b).

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
