- 3 SECTION 1. USE OF CAPITOL GROUNDS FOR NATIONAL 4 PEACE OFFICERS' MEMORIAL SERVICE.

5 The National Fraternal Order of Police and its auxil-6 iary shall be permitted to sponsor a public event, the fif-

teenth annual National Peace Officers' Memorial Service,
 on the Capitol grounds on May 15, 1996, or on such other
 date as the Speaker of the House of Representatives and
 the President pro tempore of the Senate may jointly des ignate, in order to honor the 155 law enforcement officers
 who died in the line of duty during 1995.

7 SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The event authorized to be con-9 ducted on the Capitol grounds under section 1 shall be 10 free of admission charge to the public and arranged not 11 to interfere with the needs of Congress, under conditions 12 to be prescribed by the Architect of the Capitol and the 13 Capitol Police Board.

(b) EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.—The National
Fraternal Order of Police and its auxiliary shall assume
full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities incident
to all activities associated with the event.

18 SEC. 3. EVENT PREPARATIONS.

(a) STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.—Subject to the
approval of the Architect of the Capitol, the National Fraternal Order of Police and its auxiliary are authorized to
erect upon the Capitol grounds such stage, sound amplification devices, and other related structures and equipment, as may be required for the event authorized to be
conducted on the Capitol grounds under section 1.

(b) ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.—The Architect of
 the Capitol and the Capitol Police Board are authorized
 to make any such additional arrangements as may be re quired to carry out the event.
