Ms. VELÁZQUEZ (for herself, Mr. GUTIERREZ, Mrs. KENNELLY, Mr. KEN-NEDY of Massachusetts, Mr. SERRANO, Mr. MENENDEZ, Ms. ROYBAL-ALLARD, Ms. ROS-LEHTINEN, and Mr. UNDERWOOD) submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs, and in addition to the Committee on National Security, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- Expressing the sense of the Congress that the heroism of the brave and gallant Puerto Ricans in the 65th Infantry Regiment of the United States Army who fought in the Korean conflict should be commemorated.
- Whereas the Puerto Rican soldiers of the 65th Infantry Regiment of the United States Army unselfishly fought, bled, and died for the rights and privileges of all citizens of the United States and the Republic of Korea;
- Whereas 125 soldiers of the 65th Infantry Regiment were awarded the Silver Cross and 4 received the Distin-

guished Service Cross for their heroism during the Korean conflict;

- Whereas the 65th Infantry Regiment went to the rescue of the 1st Division of the United States Marine Corps in Hagaru-ri when that division was surrounded by forces of the People's Republic of China, provided a safe corridor through which the Marines escaped, and formed a protective rear guard during the retreat to Hungnam;
- Whereas, after bitter fighting and with the forces of the People's Republic of China on their heels, the 65th Infantry Regiment was the last regiment to leave the beachhead in the Christmas eve evacuation of Hungnam on December 24, 1950;
- Whereas one night, while the 65th Infantry Regiment was encamped near the command post of the 3d Infantry Division of the United States Army during a rest and recreation leave away from the front lines, the command post of the 3d Infantry Division was attacked by over 1,000 North Korean soldiers who had infiltrated through the front lines without being detected and the 65th Infantry Regiment rallied, attacked, and subsequently destroyed the North Korean force, thereby saving the commanding officer and staff of the 3d Infantry Division from death or capture; and
- Whereas the soldiers of the 65th Infantry Division were showered with many accolades for their heroism in battle, the most famous and important of which came in the form of a letter from the commander of the United Nations forces in Korea, General of the Army Douglas Mac-Arthur: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate
 concurring), That it is the sense of the Congress that—

3 (1) the Secretary of Defense and Secretary of 4 Veterans Affairs should plan a special event jointly 5 hosted by them to commemorate the heroism of the 6 brave and gallant Puerto Ricans in the 65th Infan-7 try Regiment of the United States Army who fought 8 in the Korean conflict and rescued the 1st Marine 9 Division at Hugaru-ri and the 3d Army Infantry Di-10 vision; and

(2) the American Battle Monuments Commission should provide a plaque of suitable design and
with appropriate inscriptions at the Korean War
Veterans Memorial to commemorate the 65th Infantry Regiment.

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
