CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the Congress that the current link between the levels of earnings allowed for blind individuals entitled to disability insurance benefits and the exempt amounts allowed for purposes of the social security earnings test for individuals who have attained retirement age should be maintained.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring)*, That it is the sense of the Congress that, in
3 considering legislation providing for increases in exempt
4 amounts allowed for purposes of the social security earn-
5 ings test under section 203(f)(8) of the Social Security

1 Act for individuals who have attained retirement age, the
2 Congress should ensure that the equivalency currently pro-
3 vided between—

4 (1) such exempt amounts, and

5 (2) the levels of earnings allowed under section
6 223(d)(4) of such Act, for individuals entitled to dis-
7 ability insurance benefits based on blindness, with-
8 out demonstrating substantial gainful activity,

9 will be maintained.
