CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol grounds for the Greater Washington Soap Box Derby.

1 SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF SOAP BOX DERBY RACES 2 ON CAPITOL GROUNDS.

The Greater Washington Soap Box Derby Association (hereinafter in this resolution referred to as the "Association") shall be permitted to sponsor a public event, soap box derby races, on the Capitol grounds on July 15, 1995, or on such other date as the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President pro tempore of the Senate may jointly designate.

10 SEC. 2. CONDITIONS.

11 The event to be carried out under this resolution shall 12 be free of admission charge to the public and arranged 13 not to interfere with the needs of Congress, under condi-14 tions to be prescribed by the Architect of the Capitol and 15 the Capitol Police Board; except that the Association shall 16 assume full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities 17 incident to all activities associated with the event.

18 SEC. 3. STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.

For the purposes of this resolution, the Association is authorized to erect upon the Capitol grounds, subject to the approval of the Architect of the Capitol, such stage, sound amplification devices, and other related structures and equipment as may be required for the event to be carried out under this resolution.

1 SEC. 4. ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.

The Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol Police Board are authorized to make any such additional arrangements that may be required to carry out the event under this resolution.
