CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- Expressing the sense of the Congress concerning economic development, environmental improvement, and stability in the Baltic region.
 - 1 Whereas from 1945 to the early 1990's Kaliningrad was
 - 2 a Russian military outpost consisting of as many as
 - 3 200,000 Russian military personnel concentrated in
 - 4 an area of 15,000 square kilometers and Kaliningrad
 - 5 has suffered substantial environmental damage as a
 - 6 result of this military presence;

Whereas since this time the number of Russian military
 personnel in Kaliningrad has declined significantly, al though the number of such personnel in the region
 is still substantial;

5 Whereas polls conducted by the Kaliningrad Sociological 6 Center have shown that over 60 percent of the 7 Kaliningrad public favors development of Kaliningrad 8 as an economic bridge between Europe and Russia; 9 Whereas establishment of Kaliningrad as a free economic 10 zone by the Russian Government in 1994 represents 11 a positive step toward Kaliningrad's integration into 12 the Baltic and European economies and toward giving 13 Kaliningrad an opportunity to flourish economically 14 and to contribute substantially to the well-being of the 15 Baltic region; and

16 Whereas Russian economic analysts at the Russian For17 eign Policy Foundation have noted that militarization
18 of Kaliningrad "corresponded neither to the needs of
19 the population of the region itself, nor to the neces20 sities of its economic development": Now, therefore,
21 be it

Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate
concurring), That it is the sense of the Congress that—

24 (1) Lithuania, Latvia, and Estonia have the25 right to self-determination which extends to the con-

1	duct of their foreign policy regarding membership in
2	the North Atlantic Treaty Organization;
3	(2) development of the Kaliningrad region as a
4	free trade zone will help ensure the freedom and fu-
5	ture prosperity and stability of the Baltic region;
6	and
7	(3) continued military reductions in and envi-
8	ronmental restoration of the Kaliningrad region will
9	greatly facilitate economic development and prosper-
10	ity in Kaliningrad.
