- 6 and purposes as part of the Constitution when ratified by
- 7 the legislatures of three-fourths of the several States with-

- 1 in seven years after the date of its submission for ratifica-
- 2 tion:
- 3 "ARTICLE —
- 4 "Neither the United States nor any State shall deny
- 5 benefits to or otherwise discriminate against any private
- 6 person or group on account of religious expression, belief,
- 7 or identity; nor shall the prohibition on laws respecting
- 8 an establishment of religion be construed to require such
- 9 discrimination.".
