Mr. EMERSON (for himself and Mr. HANSEN) introduced the following joint resolution; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States relating to voluntary school prayer.

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled*
3 *(two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-*
4 *lowing article is hereby proposed as an amendment to the*
5 *Constitution of the United States, which shall be valid to*
6 *all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution if rati-*
7 *fied by the legislatures of at least three-fourths of the sev-*

1 eral States within seven years from the date of its proposal
2 to the States by the Congress:

3 “ARTICLE —

4 “Nothing in this Constitution shall be construed to
5 prohibit individual or group prayer in public schools or
6 other public institutions. No person shall be required by
7 the United States or by any State to participate in prayer.
8 Neither the United States nor any State shall prescribe
9 the content of any such prayer.”
