A BILL

To provide for the temporary suspension of the reformulated gasoline rules under the Clean Air Act.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SUSPENSION OF REFORMULATED GASOLINE**
4 **RULES.**

5 Upon the enactment of this Act, the Environmental
6 Protection Agency rules under section 211(k) of the Clean
7 Air Act shall be suspended. Such suspension shall remain
8 in effect until such time as the Administrator—

9 (1) demonstrates, after notice and opportunity
10 for hearing, that reformulated gasoline manufac-

1 tured and distributed in accordance with such rules
2 does not cause adverse health effects; or
3 (2) revises such rules to eliminate any such ad-
4 verse health effects, and
5 submits a report to the appropriate committees of Con-
6 gress setting forth the steps taken under paragraph (1)
7 or (2).
