Mr. SOLOMON introduced the following bill; which was referred to the  
Committee on Government Reform and Oversight

## A BILL

To require random drug testing within the executive branch  
of the Government.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Executive Branch  
5 Drug Testing Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. RANDOM DRUG TESTING.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—All officers and employees within  
8 the executive branch of the Government shall be subject

1 to random drug testing in accordance with regulations  
2 prescribed by the President.

3 (b) DEFINITION.—For purposes of this Act, the term  
4 “drug” means a controlled substance, as defined by sec-  
5 tion 102(6) of the Controlled Substances Act (21 U.S.C.  
6 802(6)).

7 **SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

8 Any regulations necessary to carry out this Act shall  
9 be issued in time so that they may be implemented begin-  
10 ning not later than the 90th day after the date of the en-  
11 actment of this Act.
