Mr. ALLARD (for himself, Mr. KNOLLENBERG, and Mr. ENSIGN) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Rules

A BILL

To amend the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 to establish a point of order against certain continuing resolutions.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 That (a) title III of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974
4 is amended by adding at the end the following new section:

5 “POINT OF ORDER AGAINST CERTAIN CONTINUING
6 RESOLUTIONS

7 “SEC. 314. It shall not be in order in the House of
8 Representatives or the Senate to consider any bill or joint
9 resolution making continuing appropriations for all or part
10 of a fiscal year unless it provides that the amount which

1 would be made available or the authority which would be
2 granted respecting any pertinent project or activity (ex-
3 cept appropriated mandatory spending) shall be continued
4 at a rate of operations not exceeding the lower of—

5 “(1) ninety-five percent of the current rate; or

6 “(2) if the applicable regular appropriation Act
7 has passed both Houses, then the lowest rate per-
8 mitted by either version of that Act, except that if
9 the project or activity is funded in only one such ver-
10 sion, that project or activity shall be continued
11 under the authority granted by the one House.”.

12 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—The table of con-
13 tents set forth in section 1(b) of the Congressional Budget
14 and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 is amended by in-
15 serting after the item relating to section 313 the following
16 new item:

“Sec. 314. Point of order against certain continuing resolutions.”.
