A BILL

To provide for return of excess amounts from official allowances of Members of the House of Representatives to the Treasury for deficit reduction.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. RETURN OF EXCESS AMOUNTS FROM OFFICIAL**
2 **ALLOWANCES OF MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE**
3 **OF REPRESENTATIVES TO THE TREASURY**
4 **FOR DEFICIT REDUCTION.**

5 Notwithstanding any other law, or any rule or other
6 authority, any amount remaining in an official allowance
7 of a Member of the House of Representatives at the end
8 of the session of Congress or other period for which the
9 allowance is made available shall be returned to the
10 Treasury, to be used for deficit reduction.

11 **SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.**

12 As used in this Act—

13 (1) the term “Member of the House of Rep-
14 resentatives” means a Representative in, or a Dele-
15 gate or Resident Commissioner to, the Congress;
16 and

17 (2) the term “official allowance” means, with
18 respect to a Member of the House of Representa-
19 tives, the Clerk Hire Allowance, the Official Ex-
20 penses Allowance, or the Official Mail Allowance.
