1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF STATE REGULATIONS RE-**
4 **GARDING LABELING OF POULTRY AS FRESH.**

5 Section 23 of the Poultry Products Inspection Act (7
6 U.S.C. 467e) is amended in the second sentence by strik-
7 ing “Act, but” and inserting the following: “Act. However,
8 a State or Territory or the District of Columbia may im-

1 pose requirements regarding the use of the term ‘fresh’
2 on the labeling of any poultry, poultry part, or edible por-
3 tion of the poultry or part, in addition to any labeling re-
4 quirements imposed under this Act. In addition,”.
