A BILL

2 SECTION 1. CONTINGENCY AGREEMENT TO KEEP NA-2 TIONAL PARKS OPEN. 3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Director of the National Park Service, 4 5 may enter into an agreement with a State and political subdivisions of the State under which— 6 7 (1) employees of the State and political subdivi-8 sions of the State, identified by the Secretary and 9 State officials as having the requisite expertise and 10 background, will operate components of the National 11 Park System in the State during any period in a fis-12 cal year in which the National Park Service is un-13 able to maintain the normal level of park operations; 14 (2) prior to the time when their services may be 15 required, the Secretary, using available appropria-16 tions, will provide any training that employees of the 17 State or political subdivisions of the State may need 18 to perform operations; and 19 (3) the Secretary of the Interior may accept a 20 monetary donation from a State or political subdivi-21 sion of a State to enable the Secretary to operate
