1SECTION 1. WAIVER OF LIMITATION ON ACCEPTANCE OF2VOLUNTARY SERVICES OF EMPLOYEES OF3THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT WHO4HAVE BEEN FURLOUGHED DUE TO A LAPSE5IN APPROPRIATIONS.

6 Notwithstanding section 1342 of title 31, United 7 States Code, an officer or employee of the United States 8 Government, or of the District of Columbia government, 9 may accept the voluntary services of an employee of the 10 United States Government, or an employee of the District 11 of Columbia government, as the case may be, who has 12 been furloughed due to a lapse in appropriations.
