## A BILL

To allow employees of the United States Government who have been furloughed, due to a lapse in appropriations, to volunteer to work to serve the needs of the people of the United States, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. WAIVER OF LIMITATION ON ACCEPTANCE OF**  
2 **VOLUNTARY SERVICES OF EMPLOYEES OF**  
3 **THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT WHO**  
4 **HAVE BEEN FURLOUGHED DUE TO A LAPSE**  
5 **IN APPROPRIATIONS.**

6 Notwithstanding section 1342 of title 31, United  
7 States Code, an officer or employee of the United States  
8 Government, or of the District of Columbia government,  
9 may accept the voluntary services of an employee of the  
10 United States Government, or an employee of the District  
11 of Columbia government, as the case may be, who has  
12 been furloughed due to a lapse in appropriations.
