5	within one year of the date of such deportation".

9	(1) inserting after "Any alien who" the follow-
10	ing: "had the intent to illegally enter the United
11	States and"; and
12	(2) striking "and (a) who seeks admission with-
13	in 5 years of the date of such deportation or re-
14	moval, or (b) seeks admission within 20 years in the
15	case of an alien convicted of an aggravated felony,".
