A BILL

To restore the grave marker allowance for veterans.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. GRAVE MARKER ALLOWANCE.
- 4 Section 906 of title 38, United States Code, is
- 5 amended by adding at the end the following new sub-
- 6 section:
- 7 "(e) In lieu of furnishing a headstone or marker
- 8 under subsection (a)(2) or (b) of this section, the Sec-
- 9 retary, in the Secretary's discretion, having due regard for
- 10 the circumstances in each case, may reimburse the person
- 11 entitled to request such headstone or marker for the cost
- 12 of acquiring a non-Government headstone or marker for

- 1 placement in any cemetery other than a national cemetery
- 2 in connection with the burial or memorialization of the de-
- 3 ceased individual. The cost referred to in the preceding
- 4 sentence is the cost actually incurred by or on behalf of
- 5 such person or the cost prepaid by the deceased individual
- 6 as the case may be. Reimbursement under this subsection
- 7 may be made only upon the request of the person entitled
- 8 to request the headstone or marker and may not be made
- 9 in an amount in excess of the average actual cost, as deter-
- 10 mined by the Secretary, of headstones and markers fur-
- 11 nished under subsections (a) and (b) of this section.".
