A BILL

To assist State and local governments in recovering from recent disasters.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Fiscal Year 1996 Dis-

5 aster Recovery Flexibility Act".

6 SEC. 2. WAIVER AUTHORITY.

7 Except as provided in section 3 and notwithstanding
8 any other provision of law, the Secretary of Housing and
9 Urban Development may waive, or specify alternative re-

quirements for, any provision of any statute or regulation
 that the Secretary administers in connection with the obli gation by the Secretary or the use by any recipient of any
 funds or loan guarantees appropriated or made available
 to the Department of Housing and Urban Development
 for fiscal year 1996, but only upon a finding by the Sec retary that such waiver—

8 (1) is required to facilitate the obligation or use 9 of such funds or guarantees for activities in an area 10 for which the President has declared a major disas-11 ter under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and 12 Emergency Assistance Act; and

(2) would not be inconsistent with the overallpurposes of the statute or regulation.

15 Any such waiver shall apply only to such funds or guaran-16 tees that are used for activities in such a disaster area.

17 SEC. 3. EXCEPTIONS.

18 The Secretary may not waive or specify alternative 19 requirements under this Act for any requirements of any 20 statute or regulation relating to fair housing or non-21 discrimination, the environment, or labor standards.

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
