A BILL

To amend title 49, United States Code, to exempt from regulation the transportation of certain hazardous materials by vehicles with a gross vehicle weight rating of 10,000 pounds or less.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

1	SECTION 1. EXEMPTION OF CERTAIN HAZARDOUS MATE-
2	RIAL TRANSPORTATION FROM REGULATION.
3	Section 5117 of title 49, United States Code, is
4	amended by redesignating subsections (c) and (d) as sub-
5	sections (d) and (e), respectively, and by inserting after
6	subsection (b) the following:
7	"(c) STATUTORY EXEMPTION.—This chapter and
8	regulations prescribed under this chapter shall not apply
9	to—
10	"(1) any vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rat-
11	ing of 10,000 pounds or less transporting a sub-
12	stance or material—
13	"(A) designated as a hazardous material
14	under this chapter (or the Hazardous Materials
15	Transportation Act) on or before January 1,
16	1996; and
17	"(B) for which placarding of a motor vehi-
18	cle was not required as of January 1, 1996,
19	under regulations prescribed under this chapter
20	(or the Hazardous Materials Transportation
21	Act); and
22	"(2) any vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rat-
23	ing of 10,000 pounds or less transporting a sub-
24	stance or material designated as a hazardous mate-
25	rial under this chapter after January 1, 1996, unless
26	the Secretary determines that the hazardous mate-
