Mr. BUYER introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

## A BILL

To amend title 49, United States Code, to exclude not-for-hire transportation of agricultural production materials from regulation under the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. EXCLUSION.**

4       Section 5117(d)(2) of title 49, United States Code,  
5       is amended—

6               (1) by striking “do not prohibit”;

7               (2) in subparagraph (A)—

1 (A) by inserting “do not prohibit” before  
2 “or regulate”; and

3 (B) by striking “or” the last place it ap-  
4 pears;

5 (3) in subparagraph (B) by inserting “do not  
6 prohibit” before “transportation”;

7 (4) by striking the period at the end of sub-  
8 paragraph (B) and inserting “; or”; and

9 (5) by adding at the end the following:

10 “(C) do not regulate the not-for-hire trans-  
11 portation of an agricultural production material  
12 from a source of supply to a farm, from a farm  
13 to another farm, from a field to another field on  
14 a farm, or from the farm back to the source of  
15 supply.”.

16 **SEC. 2. AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION MATERIAL DEFINED.**

17 Section 5117 of title 49, United States Code, is  
18 amended by adding at the end the following:

19 “(f) AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION MATERIAL DE-  
20 FINED.—In this section, the term ‘agricultural production  
21 material’ means a hazardous material that is used to sup-  
22 port the production of an agricultural commodity and in-  
23 cludes pesticides, fertilizers, and fuels.”.
