A BILL

To amend title 49, United States Code, to require the use of dogs or other appropriate animals at major airports for the purpose of detecting plastic explosives and other devices which may be used in airport piracy and which cannot be detected by metal detectors.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Aviation Security Im-
- 5 provement Act of 1996".

1 SEC. 2. SCREENING BY DOGS.

2	Section 44903(b) of title 49, United States Code, is
3	amended by adding at the end of the following new para-
4	graph:
5	"(3) Use of dogs in screening.—
6	"(A) IN GENERAL.—The law enforcement
7	presence and capability required under para-
8	graph (1) shall include a requirement that the
9	operator of each major airport use dogs or
10	other appropriate animals in screening pas-
11	sengers and cargo for the purpose of detecting
12	plastic explosives and other devices or materials
13	which may be used in aircraft piracy and which
14	cannot be detected by metal detectors.
15	"(B) Major airport defined.—In this
16	paragraph, the term 'major airport' means an
17	airport that is one of the largest 50 airports in
18	the United States, as determined by the num-
19	ber of passenger enplanements in calendar year
20	1995.".
21	SEC. 3. EXPLOSIVE DETECTION K-9 TEAMS.
22	Section 44913(b) of title 49, United States Code, is
23	amended to read as follows:
24	"(b) Explosive Detection K-9 Teams.—
25	"(1) Grants.—The Secretary shall make
26	grants for expenses of training and evaluation of

dogs for the explosive detection K–9 team training program for the purpose of detecting explosives at airports and aboard aircraft. Not later than 180 days after the date of the enactment of the Aviation Security Improvement Act of 1996, the Secretary shall extend such program to the largest 50 airports in the United States, as determined by the number of passenger enplanements in calendar year 1995.

"(2) Funding.—There is authorized to be appropriated from the Trust Fund for carrying out paragraph (1) such sums as may be necessary for fiscal years beginning after September 30, 1996. Such funds shall remain available until expended.".
