# A BILL

To require the Secretary of the Interior to sell the Sly Park Dam and Reservoir, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Sly Park Unit Convey-

5 ance Act".

#### 6 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.

7 For purposes of this Act:

8 (1) The term "El Dorado Irrigation District"
9 or "District" means a political subdivision of the
10 State of California duly organized, existing, and act-

ing pursuant to the laws thereof with its principal
 place of business in the city of Placerville, El Do rado County, California.

4 (2) The term "Secretary" means the Secretary5 of the Interior.

6 (3) The term "Sly Park Unit" means the Sly 7 Park Dam and Reservoir, Camp Creek Diversion 8 Dam and Tunnel and conduits and canals as authorized under the Act entitled "An Act to authorize the 9 10 American River Basin Development, California, for 11 irrigation and reclamation, and for other purposes", 12 approved October 14, 1949 (63 Stat. 852 chapter 13 690), together with all other facilities owned by the 14 United States including those used to convey and 15 store water delivered from Sly Park, as well as all 16 recreation facilities associated thereto.

#### 17 SEC. 3. SALE OF THE SLY PARK UNIT.

18 (a) The Secretary shall, on or before December 31, 19 1997, and upon receipt of the payment for the original 20 construction debt described in subsection (b), sell and con-21 vey to the El Dorado Irrigation District all right, title, 22 and interest of the United States in and to the Sly Park 23 Unit. At the time the Sly Park Unit is conveyed, the Sec-24 retary shall also transfer and assign to the District the 25 water rights relating to the Sly Park Unit held in trust by the Secretary for diversion and storage under Califor nia State permits numbered 2631 and 12258 and other
 valid permits issued by the California State Water Re sources Control Board.

5 (b) The sale price for the Sly Park Unit shall be \$1,439,505, which is the net present value of the out-6 7 standing balance for the original construction of the Sly 8 Park Unit payable to the United States. Payment shall 9 be deposited as miscellaneous receipts in the Treasury and 10 credited to the Central Valley Project Restoration Fund. Payment of such price shall extinguish all payment obliga-11 tions under contract numbered 14-06-200-949IR1 be-12 13 tween the District and the Secretary.

#### 14 SEC. 4. CERTAIN CONTRACT OBLIGATIONS NOT AFFECTED.

The sale of the Sly Park Unit under this Act shall not affect the payment obligations of the District under the contract between the District and the Secretary numbered 14–06–200–7734, as amended by contracts numbered 14–06–200–4282A and 14–06–200–8536A.

# 20 SEC. 5. TREATMENT OF SALES FOR PURPOSES OF CERTAIN 21 LAWS.

(a) The sales of assets under this Act shall not be
considered a disposal of Federal surplus property under
the following provisions of law:

(1) Section 203 of the Federal Property and
 Administrative Services Act of 1949 (40 U.S.C.
 484).

4 (2) Section 13 of the Surplus Property Act of
5 1944 (50 U.S.C. App. 1622).

6 (b) The Congress specifically finds that (1) the sale, 7 conveyance and assignment of the Sly Park Unit and 8 water rights under this Act involves the transfer of the 9 ownership and operation of an existing ongoing water 10 project, (2) the Sly Park Unit operation, facilities, and water rights have been, and after the sale and transfer 11 12 will continue to be, committed to maximum reasonable and 13 beneficial use for existing services, in accordance with State of California water law, and (3) the sale, conveyance 14 15 and assignment of the Sly Park Unit and water rights does not involve any additional growth or expansion of the 16 17 Project or other environmental impacts. The sale, conveyance and assignment of the Sly Park Unit and water 18 rights is consistent with the National Environmental Pol-19 icy Act of 1969 (42 U.S.C. 4332) and the Endangered 20 21 Species Act of 1973 (16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.) without ad-22 ditional environmental review and, consequently, no new 23 environmental documentation is required pursuant to such 24 Acts.

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
