amended in subdivision (a) be adding at the end the fol-1 lowing new sentence: "The term 'instruments and appara-2 tus' under subheading 9810.00.60 includes separable com-3 ponents of an instrument or apparatus listed in this sub-4 5 division that are imported for assembly in the United States in such instrument or apparatus in a case in which 6 7 the instrument or apparatus, due to its size and complexity, cannot be imported in its assembled state.". 8

9 SEC. 2. MODIFICATIONS OF REGULATIONS.
