A BILL

To support the California-Federal (CALFED) Bay-Delta Program in developing, funding, and implementing a balanced, long-term solution to the problems of ecosystem quality, water quality, water supply and reliability, and system vulnerability affecting the San Francisco Bay/ Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta Watershed (the Bay-Delta) in California.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 Section 1. Short Title.

4 The Act may be cited as the "California Bay-Delta5 Environmental Enhancement and Water Security Act".

6 SEC. 2. PROGRAM FUNDING.

7 (a) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—For each 8 of the fiscal years 1998, 1999, and 2000, there are author-9 ized to be appropriated an additional \$143,300,000 for 10 both (1) the initial Federal share of the cost of developing 11 and implementing that portion of an ecosystem protection plan for the Bay-Delta, referred to as "the Category III 12 13 program" emanating out of the document entitled "Prin-14 ciples for Agreement on Bay-Delta Standards Between the 15 State of California and the Federal Government", dated 16 December 15, 1994, and, (2) the initial Federal share of the cost of developing and implementing the ecosystem 17 restoration elements of the long-term CALFED Bay-Delta 18 19 Program, pursuant to the cost sharing agreement required by section 78684.10 of California Senate Bill 900, Chap-20 ter 135, Statutes of 1996, signed by the Governor of Cali-21 fornia on July 11, 1996. Funds appropriated pursuant to 22 23 this section shall remain available until expended and shall be administered in accordance with procedures established 24 HR 4126 IH

by CALFED Bay-Delta Program until Congress author izes another entity that is recommended by CALFED
Bay-Delta Program to carry out this section.

4 (b) Funds authorized to be appropriated pursuant to 5 this section to those agencies that are currently or subsequently become participants in the CALFED Bay-Delta 6 7 Program shall be in addition to the baseline funding levels 8 established pursuant to section 3 of this Act, for currently 9 authorized projects and programs under the Central Val-10 ley Project Improvement Act, title 34 of Public Law 102– 575 and other currently authorized federal programs for 11 12 the purpose of Bay-Delta ecosystem protection and restoration. 13

14 (c) Nothing in this Act shall be deemed to diminish 15 the Federal interest in and responsibility for working with the State of California through the CALFED Bay-Delta 16 Program in developing, funding and implementing a bal-17 anced, long-term solution to the problems of ecosystem 18 19 quality, water quality, water supply and reliability, and 20 system vulnerability affecting the San Francisco Bay/Sac-21 ramento-San Joaquin Delta Watershed in California. Par-22 ticipation in such long term solution shall only be under-23 taken pursuant to authorization provided by law other 24 than this Act, and shall be based on the equitable allocation of program costs among beneficiary groups that the
CALFED Bay-Delta programs shall develop.

3 (d) To the extent not otherwise authorized, those 4 agencies and departments that are currently or subse-5 quently become participants in the CALFED Bay-Delta Program are hereby authorized to undertake the activities 6 7 and programs for which Federal cost sharing is provided 8 by this section. The United States shall immediately initi-9 ate coordinated consultations and negotiations with the 10 State of California to expeditiously execute the cost-sharing agreement required by section 78684.10 of California 11 Senate Bill 900, Chapter 135, Statutes of 1996, signed 12 by the Governor of California on July 11, 1996. Such ac-13 tivities shall include, but not be limited to, planning, de-14 15 sign, technical assistance and construction for ecosystem restoration programs and projects. 16

17 SEC. 3. BUDGET CROSSCUT.

18 The Office of Management and Budget is directed to 19 submit to the House and Senate Committees on Appro-20 priations, as part of the President's Fiscal Year 1998 21 Budget, an interagency budget crosscut that displays Fed-22 eral spending for fiscal years 1993 through 1998 on eco-23 system restoration and other purposes in the Bay-Delta 24 region, separately showing funding provided previously or 1 requested under both pre-existing authorities and new au-

2 thorities granted by this Act.

3 SEC. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.

4 Section 2 of this Act shall take effect on the date5 of passage of California State Proposition 204.

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
