Mr. Franks of New Jersey (for himself and Mr. Flake) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Banking and Financial Services

A BILL

- To require the Secretary of the Treasury to mint coins in commemoration of the 50th anniversary of the breaking of the color barrier in major league baseball by Jackie Robinson.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Jackie Robinson Com-
 - 5 memorative Coin Act".
 - 6 SEC. 2. COIN SPECIFICATIONS.
- 7 (a) \$1 SILVER COINS.—In commemoration of the
- 8 50th anniversary of the breaking of the color barrier in

major league baseball by Jackie Robinson, the Secretary of the Treasury (hereafter in this Act referred to as the "Secretary") shall mint and issue not more than 500,000 3 1 dollar coins, which shall— 5 (1) weigh 26.73 grams; 6 (2) have a diameter of 1.500 inches; and 7 (3) contain 90 percent silver and 10 percent 8 copper. 9 (b) Legal Tender.—The coins minted under this 10 Act shall be legal tender, as provided in section 5103 of title 31, United States Code. 12 (c) Numismatic Items.—For purposes of section 5136 of title 31, United States Code, all coins minted under this Act shall be considered to be numismatic items. 14 15 SEC. 3. SOURCES OF BULLION. 16 The Secretary shall obtain silver for minting coins under this Act only from stockpiles established under the 18 Strategic and Critical Materials Stock Piling Act. 19 SEC. 4. DESIGN OF COINS. 20 (a) Design Requirements.— 21 (1) In General.—The design— 22 (A) on the obverse side of the coins minted 23 under this Act shall be emblematic of Jackie

Robinson; and

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1	(B) on the reverse side of such coins shall
2	be emblematic of Jackie Robinson's association
3	with and contributions to major league baseball.
4	(2) Designation and inscriptions.—On
5	each coin minted under this Act there shall be—
6	(A) a designation of the value of the coin;
7	(B) an inscription of the year "1997"; and
8	(C) inscriptions of the words "Liberty",
9	"In God We Trust", "United States of Amer-
10	ica", and "E Pluribus Unum".
11	(b) Selection.—The design for the coins minted
12	under this Act shall be—
13	(1) selected by the Secretary after consultation
14	with the Jackie Robinson Foundation and the Com-
15	mission of Fine Arts; and
16	(2) reviewed by the Citizens Commemorative
17	Coin Advisory Committee.
18	SEC. 5. ISSUANCE OF COINS.
19	(a) QUALITY OF COINS.—Coins minted under this
20	Act shall be issued in uncirculated and proof qualities.
21	(b) MINT FACILITY.—Only 1 facility of the United
22	States Mint may be used to strike any particular quality
23	of the coins minted under this Act.

1	(c) Commencement of Issuance.—The Secretary
2	may issue coins minted under this Act beginning April 15
3	1997.
4	(d) TERMINATION OF MINTING AUTHORITY.—No
5	coins may be minted under this Act after December 15
6	1998.
7	SEC. 6. SALE OF COINS.
8	(a) Sale Price.—The coins issued under this Act
9	shall be sold by the Secretary at a price equal to the sum
10	of—
11	(1) the face value of the coins;
12	(2) the surcharge provided in subsection (d)
13	with respect to such coins; and
14	(3) the cost of designing and issuing the coins
15	(including labor, materials, dies, use of machinery
16	overhead expenses, marketing, and shipping).
17	(b) Bulk Sales.—The Secretary shall make bulk
18	sales of the coins issued under this Act at a reasonable
19	discount.
20	(c) Prepaid Orders.—
21	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall accept
22	prepaid orders for the coins minted under this Act
23	before the issuance of such coins.

1	(2) DISCOUNT.—Sale prices with respect to pre-
2	paid orders under paragraph (1) shall be at a rea-
3	sonable discount.
4	(d) Surcharges.—All sales shall include a sur-
5	charge of \$10 per coin.
6	SEC. 7. GENERAL WAIVER OF PROCUREMENT REGULA
7	TIONS.
8	(a) In General.—Except as provided in subsection
9	(b), no provision of law governing procurement or public
10	contracts shall be applicable to the procurement of goods
11	and services necessary for carrying out the provisions of
12	this Act.
13	(b) Equal Employment Opportunity.—Sub-
14	section (a) shall not relieve any person entering into a con-
15	tract under the authority of this Act from complying with
16	any law relating to equal employment opportunity.
17	SEC. 8. DISTRIBUTION OF SURCHARGES.
18	Subject to section 10(a), all surcharges received by
19	the Secretary from the sale of coins issued under this Act
20	shall be promptly paid by the Secretary to the Jackie Rob-
21	inson Foundation (hereafter in this Act referred to as the
22	Foundation") for the purpose of—
23	(1) enhancing the programs of the Foundation
24	in the field of education and youth leadership skills
25	development; and

1 (2) increasing the availability of scholarships 2 for youth with the greatest need. 3 SEC. 9. FINANCIAL ASSURANCES. (a) No Net Cost to the Government.—The Sec-4 retary shall take such actions as may be necessary to ensure that minting and issuing coins under this Act will not result in any net cost to the United States Govern-8 ment. 9 (b) Payment for Coins.—A coin shall not be issued 10 under this Act unless the Secretary has received— 11 (1) full payment for the coin; 12 (2) security satisfactory to the Secretary to in-13 demnify the United States for full payment; or 14 (3) a guarantee of full payment satisfactory to 15 the Secretary from a depository institution whose 16 deposits are insured by the Federal Deposit Insur-17 ance Corporation or the National Credit Union Ad-18 ministration Board. 19 SEC. 10. CONDITIONS ON PAYMENT OF SURCHARGES. 20 (a) Payment of Surcharges.—Notwithstanding 21 any other provision of law, no amount derived from the proceeds of any surcharge imposed on the sale of coins issued under this Act shall be paid to the Foundation un-

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- (1) all numismatic operation and program costs allocable to the program under which such coins are produced and sold have been recovered; and
 - (2) the Foundation submits an audited financial statement which demonstrates to the satisfaction of the Secretary that, with respect to all projects or purposes for which the proceeds of such surcharge may be used, the Foundation has raised funds from private sources for such projects and purposes in an amount which is equal to or greater than the maximum amount the Foundation may receive from the proceeds of such surcharge.

(b) ANNUAL AUDITS.—

(1) Annual audits of recipients required.—The Foundation shall provide, as a condition for receiving any amount derived from the proceeds of any surcharge imposed on the sale of coins issued under this Act, for an annual audit, in accordance with generally accepted government auditing standards by an independent public accountant selected by the Foundation, of all such payments to the Foundation beginning in the first fiscal year of the Foundation in which any such amount is received and continuing until all such amounts re-

- ceived by the Foundation with respect to such surcharges are fully expended or placed in trust.

 (2) MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR ANNUAL AU-
 - (2) MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR ANNUAL AUDITS.—At a minimum, each audit of the Foundation pursuant to paragraph (1) shall report—
 - (A) the amount of payments received by the Foundation during the fiscal year of the Foundation for which the audit is conducted which are derived from the proceeds of any surcharge imposed on the sale of coins issued under this Act;
 - (B) the amount expended by the Foundation from the proceeds of such surcharges during the fiscal year of the Foundation for which the audit is conducted; and
 - (C) whether all expenditures by the Foundation from the proceeds of such surcharges during the fiscal year of the Foundation for which the audit is conducted were for authorized purposes.
 - (3) RESPONSIBILITY OF FOUNDATION TO ACCOUNT FOR EXPENDITURES OF SURCHARGES.—The Foundation shall take appropriate steps, as a condition for receiving any payment of any amount derived from the proceeds of any surcharge imposed on

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- the sale of coins issued under this Act, to ensure that the receipt of the payment and the expenditure of the proceeds of such surcharge by the Foundation in each fiscal year of the Foundation can be accounted for separately from all other revenues and expenditures of the Foundation.
 - (4) Submission of audit report.—Not later than 90 days after the end of any fiscal year of the Foundation for which an audit is required under paragraph (1), the Foundation shall—
- 11 (A) submit a copy of the report to the Sec-12 retary; and
 - (B) make a copy of the report available to the public.
 - (5) Use of surcharges for audits.—The Foundation may use any amount received from payments derived from the proceeds of any surcharge imposed on the sale of coins issued under this Act to pay the cost of an audit required under paragraph (1).
 - (6) WAIVER OF SUBSECTION.—The Secretary may waive the application of any paragraph of this subsection to the Foundation for any fiscal year after taking into account the amount of surcharges

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- which such Foundation received or expended duringsuch year.
- 3 (7) Availability of Books and Records.— The Foundation shall provide, as a condition for re-5 ceiving any payment derived from the proceeds of 6 any surcharge imposed on the sale of coins issued 7 under this Act, to the Inspector General of the De-8 partment of the Treasury or the Comptroller Gen-9 eral of the United States, upon the request of such 10 Inspector General or the Comptroller General, all 11 books, records, and workpapers belonging to or used 12 by the Foundation, or by any independent public ac-13 countant who audited the Foundation in accordance 14 with paragraph (1), which may relate to the receipt 15 or expenditure of any such amount by the Founda-16 tion.
- 17 (c) USE OF AGENTS OR ATTORNEYS TO INFLUENCE
 18 COMMEMORATIVE COIN LEGISLATION.—No portion of any
 19 payment to the Foundation from amounts derived from
 20 the proceeds of surcharges imposed on the sale of coins
 21 issued under this Act may be used, directly or indirectly,
 22 by the Foundation to compensate any agent or attorney

for services rendered to support or influence in any way

- 1 legislative action of the Congress relating to the coins
- 2 minted and issued under this Act.

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
