## A BILL

To provide funding for the nutrition education and training program authorized under the Child Nutrition Act of 1966, and for other purposes.

1        *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2        *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3        **SECTION 1. FUNDING FOR NUTRITION EDUCATION AND**  
4        **TRAINING.**

5        (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 19(i) of the Child Nutri-  
6        tion Act of 1966 (42 U.S.C. 1788(i)) is amended—

1           (1) in the first sentence of paragraph (2)(A), by  
2           striking “and \$10,000,000 for fiscal year 1996” and  
3           inserting “, \$10,000,000 for fiscal year 1996, and  
4           \$7,500,000 for fiscal year 1997”; and

5           (2) in paragraph (3)—

6           (A) in the paragraph heading, by striking  
7           “1997” and inserting “1998”; and

8           (B) in subparagraph (A), by striking  
9           “1997” and inserting “1998”.

10          (b) OFFSETTING REDUCTION IN EMERGENCY FOOD  
11 ASSISTANCE ACT.—Notwithstanding section 27 of the  
12 Food Stamp Act of 1977 (7 U.S.C. 2036), the Secretary  
13 of Agriculture shall purchase not more than \$96,250,000  
14 of commodities under section 27 of the Act for fiscal year  
15 1997.

16          (c) OFFSETTING REDUCTION IN SCHOOL MEALS INI-  
17 TIATIVE FOR HEALTHY CHILDREN.—Of the amounts  
18 made available to carry out the National School Lunch  
19 Act (42 U.S.C. 1751 et seq.) and the Child Nutrition Act  
20 of 1966 (42 U.S.C. 1771 et seq.) under the heading  
21 “CHILD NUTRITION PROGRAMS” under the heading “DO-  
22 MESTIC FOOD PROGRAMS” in title IV of the Agri-  
23 culture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administra-  
24 tion, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 1997 (110  
25 Stat. 1589), not more than \$6,250,000 may be used to

1 carry out the school meals initiative for healthy children  
2 (60 Fed. Reg. 31188 (1995)). None of the funds made  
3 available for the school meals initiative for healthy chil-  
4 dren for fiscal year 1997 may be used for in-school edu-  
5 cation materials. Not more than \$1,050,000 may be used  
6 for technical assistance materials.

7 (d) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This section and the amend-  
8 ments made by this section shall be effective as of October  
9 1, 1996.
