# H. RES. 111

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 807) to protect the Constitution of the United States from unauthorized encroachment into legislative powers by the executive branch, and to protect the American taxpayer from unauthorized encroachment into his wallet by an unconstitutional action of the President.

Mr. STOCKMAN submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules

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## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 807) to protect the Constitution of the United States from unauthorized encroachment into legislative powers by the executive branch, and to protect the American taxpayer from unauthorized encroachment into his wallet by an unconstitutional action of the President.

1       *Resolved*, That immediately upon the adoption of this  
2 resolution, the House shall resolve itself into the Commit-  
3 tee of the Whole House on the state of the Union for con-  
4 sideration of the bill (H.R. 807) to protect the Constitu-  
5 tion of the United States from unauthorized encroachment  
6 into legislative powers by the executive branch, and to pro-

1 tect the American taxpayer from unauthorized encroach-  
2 ment into his wallet by an unconstitutional action of the  
3 President. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed  
4 with. All points of order against the bill and against its  
5 consideration are hereby waived. General debate shall be  
6 confined to the bill and the amendment offered by Rep-  
7 resentative Stockman of Texas, and shall not exceed two  
8 hours, one hour to be equally divided and controlled by  
9 the chairman and ranking minority member of the Com-  
10 mittee on Banking and Financial Services, and one hour  
11 to be equally divided and controlled by Representative  
12 Volkmer of Missouri and Representative Stockman of  
13 Texas. After general debate the bill shall be considered  
14 for amendment under the five-minute rule for a period not  
15 to exceed one hour. No amendment to the bill shall be  
16 in order except an amendment in the nature of a sub-  
17 stitute offered by Representative Stockman of Texas. All  
18 points of order against the amendment in the nature of  
19 a substitute are hereby waived, and the amendment shall  
20 not be subject to amendment. At the conclusion of the con-  
21 sideration of the bill for amendment, the Committee shall  
22 rise and report the bill back to the House with such  
23 amendment as may have been finally adopted, and the pre-  
24 vious question shall be considered as ordered on the bill  
25 and such amendment thereto to final passage without in-

1 intervening motion except one motion to recommit without  
2 instructions.
