RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives that
Children are America's Greatest Assets.

Whereas it is a tradition of long standing and significance for
twenty-three years that all Americans observe and cele-
brate such special occasions as Children's Day, the sec-
ond Sunday in June;

Whereas as a group of citizens of the State of New York, led
by Dr. Benjamin W. Watkins, Locality Mayor of Harlem,
is planning various activities to educate our children
about drugs, AIDS, and the polarization of races;

Whereas it is our hope that democracy is not a finished prod-
uct but a constant goal, and that in the struggle to attain
perfection of that goal, our children are the hope of this
world today and the leaders of the world tomorrow; and

Whereas although we live in a time of many complicated problems, we are aware that we must constantly strive to improve our world so that our children may reap the benefits of peace and increasing universal love and brotherhood: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That it is the sense of the House of Rep-
2 resentatives that children are America's greatest assets.
3 We call upon all of the citizens of the United States of
4 America to honor, nurture, and love our children not only
5 on Children's Day, but on every day of the year.
