Mr. SOLOMON, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the joint resolution (H.J. Res. 79) proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States authorizing the Congress and the States to prohibit the physical desecration of the flag of the United States.

- 1 *Resolved*, That upon the adoption of this resolution
- 2 it shall be in order to consider in the House the joint reso-
- 3 lution (H.J. Res. 79) proposing an amendment to the Con-
- 4 stitution of the United States authorizing the Congress
- 5 and the States to prohibit the physical desecration of the

1 flag of the United States. The joint resolution shall be de-
2 batable for one hour equally divided and controlled by the
3 chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee
4 on the Judiciary. The previous question shall be consid-
5 ered as ordered on the joint resolution to final passage
6 without intervening motion except one motion to recom-
7 mit. The motion to recommit may include instructions
8 only if offered by the minority leader or his designee. If
9 including instructions, the motion to recommit shall be de-
10 batable for one hour equally divided and controlled by the
11 proponent and an opponent.

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
