Resolved, That during further consideration of H.R.
1977 pursuant to House Resolution 187, further consider ation of the bill for amendment in the Committee of the
Whole House on the state of the Union shall proceed with out intervening motion except: (1) amendments printed in
the portion of the Congressional Record designated for

that purpose in clause 6 of rule XXIII before July 14, 1 1995; (2) motions that the Committee rise offered by the 2 majority leader or his designee; and (3) motions that the 3 4 Committee rise and report the bill to the House with such amendments as may have been adopted offered as pref-5 erential under clause 2(d) of rule XXI. Each further 6 7 amendment to the bill may be offered only by the Member who caused it to be printed, shall be considered as read, 8 9 shall be debatable for ten minutes equally divided and con-10 trolled by the proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to amendment, and shall not be subject to a de-11 mand for division of the question in the House or in the 12 Committee of the Whole. The Chairman of the Committee 13 of the Whole may postpone until a time during further 14 15 consideration in the Committee of the Whole a request for a recorded vote on any amendment made in order by this 16 resolution. The Chairman of the Committee of the Whole 17 may reduce to not less than five minutes the time for vot-18 ing by electronic device on any postponed question that 19 immediately follows another vote by electronic device with-20 out intervening business: Provided, That the time for vot-21 ing by electronic device on the first in any series of ques-22 tions shall be not less than fifteen minutes. 23
