 House of Representatives is amended—
- 3 (1) in clause 3.(c) by inserting at the end of
 4 clause 3.(c) the following new sentence: "The term
 5 'honorarium' shall also include copyright royalties,
 6 advances or other forms of compensation for the
 7 writing, editing or creation of books, records, movies
 8 or other publications or works of art during the indi-

vidual's service as a Member, officer or employee of 1 2 the House of Representatives, other than payments 3 for actual expenses incurred in the writing or editing. A Member, officer or employee may not enter 4 5 into a contract which would provide deferred compensation or royalties for works written or edited 6 7 during service as a Member, officer or employee."; and 8

(2) by striking subparagraph 3.(e)(5).

10 (b) This resolution and the amendments made by it 11 shall prohibit the receipt of copyright royalties, advances 12 and other forms of covered compensation by any Member, 13 officer or employee after the date of adoption of this 14 resolution.
