Mr. STOCKMAN submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules

RESOLUTION

Providing for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 464) to repeal the prohibitions relating to semiautomatic assault weapons and large capacity ammunition feeding devices.

1 *Resolved*, That immediately upon the adoption of this
2 resolution, the House shall resolve itself into the Commit-
3 tee of the Whole House on the State of the Union for con-
4 sideration of the bill (H.R. 464) to repeal the prohibitions
5 relating to semiautomatic assault weapons and large ca-
6 pacity feeding devices. The first reading of the bill shall
7 be dispensed with. All points of order against the bill and
8 against its consideration are hereby waived. General de-
9 bate shall be confined to the bill and the amendment of-

1 fered by Representative Stockman of Texas, and shall not
2 exceed two hours, one hour to be equally divided and con-
3 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of
4 the Committee on the Judiciary, and one hour to be equal-
5 ly divided and controlled by Representative Volkmer of
6 Missouri and Representative Stockman of Texas. All
7 points of order against the amendment in the nature of
8 a substitute are hereby waived, and the amendment shall
9 not be subject to amendment. At the conclusion of the con-
10 sideration of the bill for amendment, the Committee shall
11 rise and report the bill back to the House with such
12 amendment as may have been finally adopted, and the pre-
13 vious question shall be considered as ordered on the bill
14 and such amendment thereto to final passage without in-
15 tervening motion except one motion to recommit without
16 instructions.
