Mr. GOSS, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1655) to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 1996 for intelligence and intelligence-related activities of the United States Government, the Community Management Account, and the Central Intelligence Agency Retirement and Disability System, and for other purposes.

- 1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
- 2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
- 3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee

1 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
2 ation of the bill (H.R. 1655) to authorize appropriations
3 for fiscal year 1996 for intelligence and intelligence-relat-
4 ed activities of the United States Government, the Com-
5 munity Management Account, and the Central Intelligence
6 Agency Retirement and Disability System, and for other
7 purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed
8 with. Points of order against consideration of the bill for
9 failure to comply with section 302(f), 308(a), or 401(b)
10 of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 are waived. Gen-
11 eral debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not ex-
12 ceed one hour equally divided and controlled by the chair-
13 man and ranking minority member of the Permanent Se-
14 lect Committee on Intelligence. After general debate the
15 bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-
16 minute rule. It shall be in order to consider as an original
17 bill for the purpose of amendment under the five-minute
18 rule the amendment in the nature of a substitute rec-
19 ommended by the Permanent Select Committee on Intel-
20 ligence now printed in the bill, modified by the amendment
21 recommended by the Committee on Government Reform
22 and Oversight now printed in the bill and by an amend-
23 ment striking title VII. The committee amendment in the
24 nature of a substitute, as modified, shall be considered by
25 title rather than by section. The first section and each title

1 shall be considered as read. Points of order against the
2 committee amendment in the nature of a substitute, as
3 modified, for failure to comply with clause 7 of rule XVI,
4 clause 5(a) of rule XXI, or section 302(f) or section
5 401(b) of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 are
6 waived. No amendment to the committee amendment in
7 the nature of a substitute, as modified, shall be in order
8 unless printed in the portion of the Congressional Record
9 designated for that purpose in clause 6 of rule XXIII. At
10 the conclusion of consideration of the bill for amendment
11 the Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House
12 with such amendments as may have been adopted. Any
13 Member may demand a separate vote in the House on any
14 amendment adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the
15 bill or to the committee amendment in the nature of a
16 substitute, as modified. The previous question shall be
17 considered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto
18 to final passage without intervening motion except one
19 motion to recommit with or without instructions.

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
