Mr. GOSS, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1162) to establish a Deficit Reduction Trust Fund and provide for the downward adjustment of discretionary spending limits in appropriation bills.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 1162) to establish a Deficit Reduc-
6 tion Trust Fund and provide for the downward adjust-

1 ment of discretionary spending limits in appropriation
2 bills. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with.
3 General debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not
4 exceed one hour equally divided and controlled by the
5 chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee
6 on Rules. After general debate the bill shall be considered
7 for amendment under the five-minute rule. It shall be in
8 order to consider as an original bill for the purpose of
9 amendment under the five-minute rule the amendment in
10 the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee
11 on Rules. The committee amendment in the nature of a
12 substitute shall be considered as read. Points of order
13 against the committee amendment in the nature of a sub-
14 stitute for failure to comply with clause 7 of rule XVI are
15 waived. During consideration of the bill for amendment,
16 the Chairman of the Committee of the Whole may accord
17 priority in recognition on the basis of whether the Member
18 offering an amendment has caused it to be printed in the
19 portion of the Congressional Record designated for that
20 purpose in clause 6 of rule XXIII. Amendments so printed
21 shall be considered as read. At the conclusion of consider-
22 ation of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise
23 and report the bill to the House with such amendments
24 as may have been adopted. Any Member may demand a
25 separate vote in the House on any amendment adopted

1 in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to the commit-
2 tee amendment in the nature of a substitute. The previous
3 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and
4 amendments thereto to final passage without intervening
5 motion except one motion to recommit with or without in-
6 structions.
