RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives that the Senate should ratify the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women.

4 is vital to the development and well-being of people
5 of all nations; and

1 (2) the Senate should, therefore, give its advice
2 and consent to the ratification of the Convention on
