# H. RES. 240

Providing for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 1710) to combat terrorism.

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## IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

OCTOBER 19, 1995

Mr. SCHUMER submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the  
Committee on Rules

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## RESOLUTION

Providing for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 1710) to  
combat terrorism.

1       *Resolved*, That immediately upon the adoption of this  
2 resolution, the House shall resolve into the Committee of  
3 the Whole House on the State of the Union for the consid-  
4 eration of the bill (H.R. 1710) to combat terrorism. The  
5 first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. All points  
6 of order against the bill and against its consideration are  
7 waived. General debate shall be confined to the bill and  
8 shall not exceed 1 hour equally divided and controlled by  
9 the Chairman and ranking minority member of the Com-  
10 mittee on the Judiciary. After general debate the bill shall  
11 be considered for amendment under the 5-minute rule.

1 Each section shall be considered as read. If on any day  
2 the Committee of the Whole rises and reports that it has  
3 come to no resolution on the bill, then on the next legisla-  
4 tive day the House shall, immediately after the third daily  
5 order of business under clause 1 of rule XXIV, resolve  
6 into the Committee of the Whole for further consideration  
7 of the bill. At the conclusion of the consideration of the  
8 bill for amendment, the Committee shall rise and report  
9 the bill to the House with such amendments as may have  
10 been adopted. The previous question shall be considered  
11 as ordered on the bill and any amendment thereto to final  
12 passage without intervening motion except 1 motion to re-  
13 commit with or without instructions.

14 SEC. 2. After the passage of H.R. 1710, it shall be  
15 in order in the House, any rule of the House to the con-  
16 trary notwithstanding, to take from the Speaker's table  
17 the bill S. 735, move to strike all after the enacting clause  
18 and insert in lieu thereof the provisions of H.R. 1710 as  
19 passed by the House. If the motion is adopted and the  
20 Senate bill, as amended, is passed, it shall then be in order  
21 to move that the House insist upon its amendment to S.  
22 735 and request a conference with the Senate thereon.

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
