RESOLUTION

Providing for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 2564) to provide for the disclosure of lobbying activities to influence the Federal Government, and for other purposes.

- 1 Resolved, That at any time after the adoption of this
- 2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
- 3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
- 4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
- 5 ation of the bill (H.R. 2564) to provide for the disclosure
- 6 of lobbying activities to influence the Federal Government,
- 7 and for other purposes. The first reading of the bill shall

- 1 be dispensed with. Points of order against consideration
- 2 of the bill for failure to comply with clause 2(l)(6) of rule
- 3 XI are waived. General debate shall be confined to the bill
- 4 and shall not exceed two hours equally divided and con-
- 5 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of
- 6 the Committee on the Judiciary. After general debate the
- 7 bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-
- 8 minute rule. The bill shall be considered as read. All points
- 9 of order against any amendment printed in the report of
- 10 the Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution are
- 11 waived. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for
- 12 amendment the Committee shall rise and report the bill
- 13 to the House with such amendments as may have been
- 14 adopted. The previous question shall be considered as or-
- 15 dered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage
- 16 without intervening motion except one motion to recommit
- 17 with or without instructions.
- SEC. 2. If H.R. 2564 is passed by the House in a
- 19 form that is identical to S. 1060, as passed by the Senate,
- 20 then at any time thereafter it shall be in order without
- 21 intervention of any point of order to consider the Senate
- 22 bill in the House. The previous question shall be consid-
- 23 ered as ordered on the Senate bill to final passage without
- 24 intervening motion except one motion to recommit.
