RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3144) to establish a United States policy for the deployment of a national missile defense system, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That upon the adoption of this resolution
2 it shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.
3 3144) to establish a United States policy for the deploy-
4 ment of a national missile defense system, and for other
5 purposes. All points of order against the bill and against
6 its consideration are waived. The previous question shall

1 be considered as ordered on the bill and any amendment
2 thereto to final passage without intervening motion except:
3 (1) two hours of debate on the bill, equally divided and
4 controlled by the chairman and ranking minority member
5 of the Committee on National Security; (2) the amend-
6 ment in the nature of a substitute printed in the report
7 of the Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution,
8 if offered by Representative Spratt of South Carolina or
9 his designee, which shall be in order without intervention
10 of any point of order, shall be considered as read, and
11 shall be separately debatable for one hour equally divided
12 and controlled by the proponent and an opponent; and (3)
13 one motion to recommit with or without instructions.
