Mr. GOSS, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 450) to ensure economy and efficiency of Federal Government operations by establishing a moratorium on regulatory rulemaking actions, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 450) to ensure economy and effi-
6 ciency of Federal Government operations by establishing

1 a moratorium on regulatory rulemaking actions, and for
2 other purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dis-
3 pensed with. General debate shall be confined to the bill
4 and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and con-
5 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of
6 the Committee on Government Reform and Oversight.
7 After general debate the bill shall be considered for
8 amendment under the five-minute rule for a period of not
9 to exceed ten hours. It shall be in order to consider as
10 an original bill for the purpose of amendment under the
11 five-minute rule the amendment in the nature of a sub-
12 stitute recommended by the Committee on Government
13 Reform and Oversight now printed in the bill. The com-
14 mittee amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be
15 considered as read. During consideration of the bill for
16 amendment, the Chairman of the Committee of the Whole
17 may accord priority in recognition on the basis of whether
18 the Member offering an amendment has caused it to be
19 printed in the portion of the Congressional Record des-
20 ignated for that purpose in clause 6 of rule XXIII. Amend-
21 ments so printed shall be considered as read. At the con-
22 clusion of consideration of the bill for amendment the
23 Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House with
24 such amendments as may have been adopted. Any Member
25 may demand a separate vote in the House on any amend-

1 ment adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill
2 or to the committee amendment in the nature of a sub-
3 stitute. The previous question shall be considered as or-
4 dered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage
5 without intervening motion except one motion to recommit
6 with or without instructions.
