7 U.S.C. 1274(a)) is amended in the undesignated para-
8 graph relating to the Missouri River, Nebraska and South

- 1 Dakota, by striking “NEBRASKA AND SOUTH DAKOTA.—
- 2 The 39-mile segment from the headwaters of Lewis and
- 3 Clark Lake” and inserting “NEBRASKA.—The segment
- 4 from the South Dakota and Nebraska border”.
