3 SECTION 1. CORRECTION TO MAP.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Interior 5 shall, before the end of the 30-day period beginning on 6 the date of the enactment of this Act, make such correc-7 tions to the map described in subsection (b) as are nec-8 essary(1) to move on that map the eastern boundary
of the excluded area covering Ocean Beach, Seaview,
Ocean Bay Park, and part of Point O'Woods to the
western boundary of the Sunken Forest Preserve;
and

6 (2) to ensure that on that map the depiction of 7 areas as "otherwise protected areas" does not in-8 clude any area that is owned by the Point O'Woods 9 Association (a privately held corporation under the 10 laws of the State of New York).

11 (b) MAP DESCRIBED.—The map described in this 12 subsection is the map that is included in a set of maps 13 entitled "Coastal Barrier Resources System", dated Octo-14 ber 24, 1990, that relates to the unit of the Coastal Bar-15 rier Resources System entitled Fire Island Unit NY–59P.
