A BILL

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Davis-Bacon Repeal
5 Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. DAVIS-BACON ACT OF 1931 REPEALED.**

2 The Act of March 3, 1931, (commonly known as the
3 Davis-Bacon Act) (40 U.S.C. 276a et seq.), is repealed.

4 **SEC. 3. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.**

5 Section 2 of the Act of June 13, 1934 (42 U.S.C.
6 276c) (commonly known as the Copeland Act) is repealed.

7 **SEC. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

8 The provisions of this Act shall take effect 30 days
9 after the date of enactment of this Act but shall not affect
10 any contract in existence on that date or made pursuant
11 to invitations for bids outstanding on that date.
